This webinar will provide an overview of Screening and Scoping, the first two steps of HIA, and discuss the importance of collaboration throughout the HIA process. During Screening, practitioners decide whether a policy or project is a good candidate for an HIA. Then, the specific health impacts that will be assessed are identified in the Scoping phase. We will provide a brief description of these two steps, ask participants to complete a few short exercises, and hear from local practitioners about how they completed these steps in their own HIA projects.
