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Why the Warriors of Wellness (WOW) Project ?

21.7% of communities of color lack health insurance vs. 14.4% of their white counterparts.


Hospitalization rates for uncontrolled diabetes are 7 times higher for African-Americans & 3 times higher for Latinos.

Hospitalization rates for congestive heart failure are 5 to 15 times higher for Native Americans.

Infant mortality & teen pregnancy disproportionally affect these groups.

Communities of color face significant health disparities. The tri-county region is the most diverse region in Oregon, with people of color representing over a quarter of the total population.





The WOW model:

- Leverages the strong relationships that organizations have with culturally specifc communities
- Improves the cultural competency of health systems to reduce the health disparities faced by communities of color.



In one year, we have:

Helped 368 individuals

Facilitated 332 medical appointments

Organized 153 support groups, language-specific classes and health events in the community.


WOW helped a senior obtain a scholarship to a gym

WOW connected a participant facing homelessness with emergency **rental assistance**

With the help of their CHW, one family connected to immigration services, the issue they identified as their top **health concern**






Together, we:


Increase cultural competency within the health care system
